Mozart K. 333: Development, Recapitulation -diagram

A clarification: the three *stages* of modulation are more commonly referred to as three *phases* of modulation. And this applies to modulation in sonata form, not everywhere!

Recapitulation

- recalls all themes (typically)
- typically all in tonic of piece (exceptions exist)
- changes, omissions, reordering all possible and noteworthy
